Abolish 153 is pleased to present the 3rd edition of its annual fundraising exhibition on May 16th, which marks twelve years since women obtained their political rights in Kuwait. This exhibition at the Hub Gallery has broadened its scope to include jewelry and sculpture, along with artworks in various media by local and regional artists. Moreover, the exhibition features artworks by Graphic Design Students from The American University of Kuwait who were asked to create posters specifically for our cause. Works featured are photographs by Kuwaiti artists Farah Salem and Mohammed Alkouh as well as award-winning Bahraini photographer Ghada Khunji; Jewelry by Kuwaiti artist Abdulla Al Awadhi and Lebanese artist Sara AbuMrad; works on paper by Saudi artist Tagreed Albagshi, Iranian artist Afsoon, Lebanese artist Jad Khoury and Kuwaiti artist Amira Behbehani, among many others. Part of the proceeds from the exhibition will benefit our campaign - to abolish a law that sanctifies the murder of female kin and treats it as a misdemeanor punishable by a maximum sentence of 3 years or 14 KD, which violates both the constitution and Islamic Sharia, and Eithar, an offshoot of the campaign that focuses on the building of shelters, the training of first responders of domestic abuse and programs to empower the public and raise awareness about the legislations that violate women's rights as human beings.

■ ithar is a civil society organization (CSO) based in Kuwait that focuses on the prevention of gender-based violence in Kuwait and across the GCC. Eithar was born out ■ of a critical need for shelters, hotlines and the training of first-responders of abuse victims. Given that Kuwait has no law to protect women or children from domestic violence, the organization's program will consolidate and develop Kuwaiti society culturally and morally to reduce violence and promote peaceful coexistence, especially by enacting strict and effective laws. Therefore, the organization works with the legislators of the State to create legislations that protect against domestic violence and to amend and abolish others in order to safeguard the dignity of all: every resident and citizen. This is a community issue that requires statistical data, civil society engagement and education. Keeping policymakers informed of the realities on the ground is a joint responsibility and we believe that Eithar can be a positive contributor to this cognitive change.

Eithar is dedicated to the specific cause of ending gender-based violence as a social, economic and legal practice by raising awareness, lobbying MPs and working alongside NGO's and CSO's with similar goals.

In the Arabic language, dots on the letters came in at a later stage. Adding or subtracting dots changes the letter and thus the meaning. If you put the dots on a seen (s), making it a sheen (sh), you will get a common Arab proverb say "She is an evil that you must have" while removing the dots makes it read "She is a secret you must have." Although the dots were not put directly above the seen they are found within the piece, to be interpreted as whichever meaning the wearer or the viewer prefers.







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



Graphic Design Students

Graphic Design students at the American University of Kuwait recently participated in a poster design competition for Abolish 153 Art Exhibition. Under the direction of Professor Maryam Hosseinnia, students were given an opportunity to produce work that highlights an important local social issue. Through means of image and text, students used their design skills to create posters for the exhibition. Out of eighteen student poster submissions, seven designs were selected to be in the exhibition.

This was the first time many of the university graphic design students had an opportunity to work with a client. 
